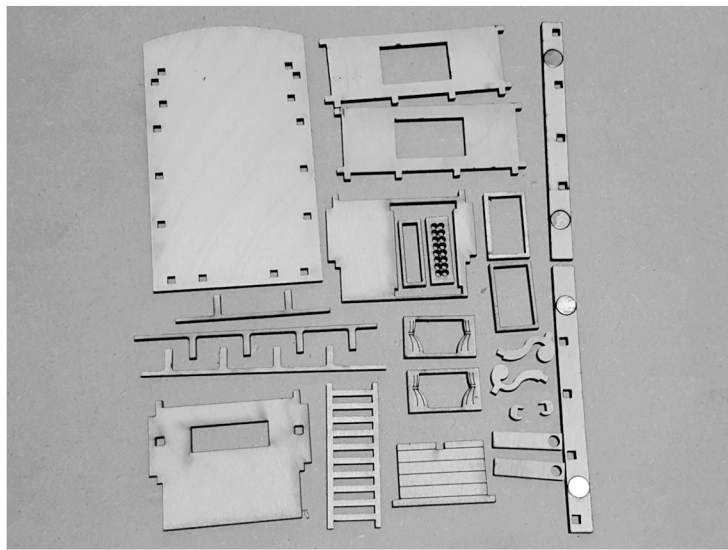
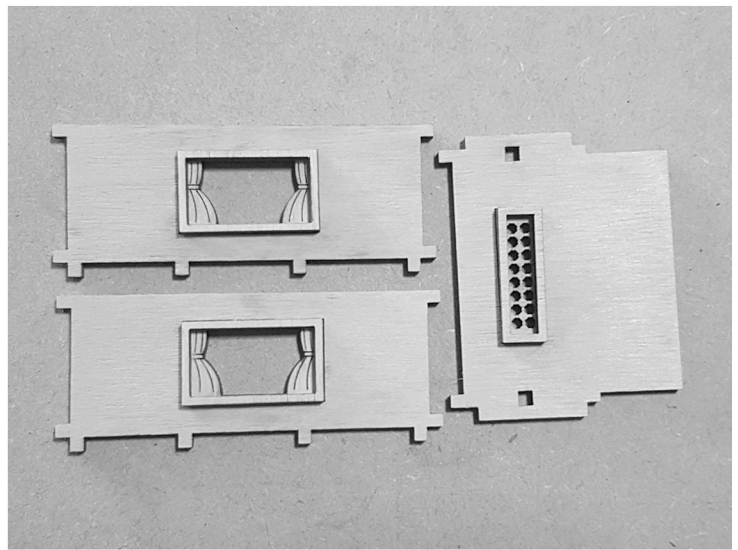


Thank you for purchasing the Level Bedded D&D Cabin Expansion. We recommend using a standard PVA wood glue on this product to ensure a good bond to the wood. Other useful tiils to help you assemble your D&D Wagon kit would be a toothpick or brush to apply the PVA with masking tape to help hold it in place whilst it glues up.

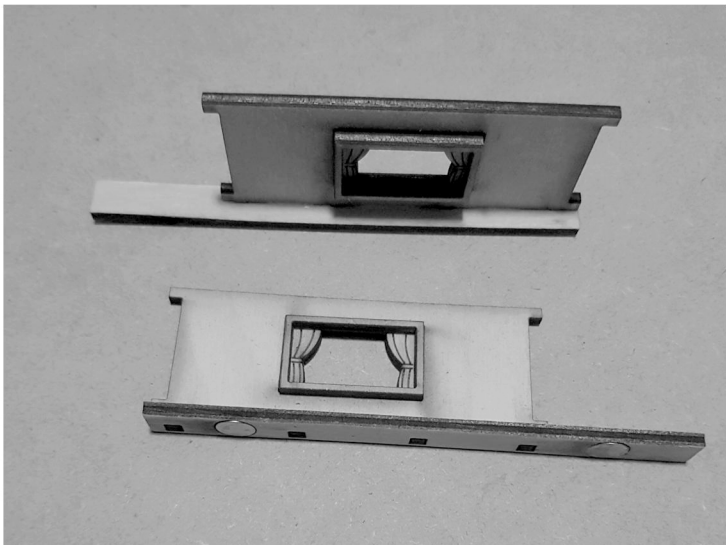

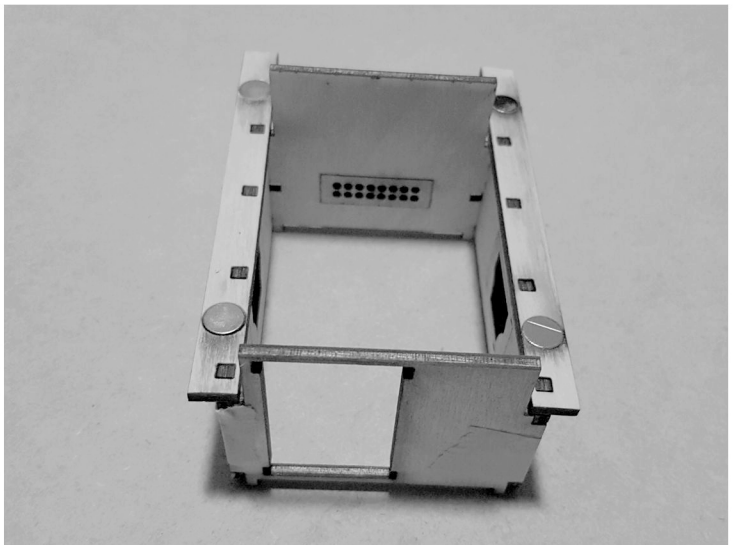
Cabin: Layout all the parts needed for your wagon. Your D&D cabin expansion set will include all of the above parts.



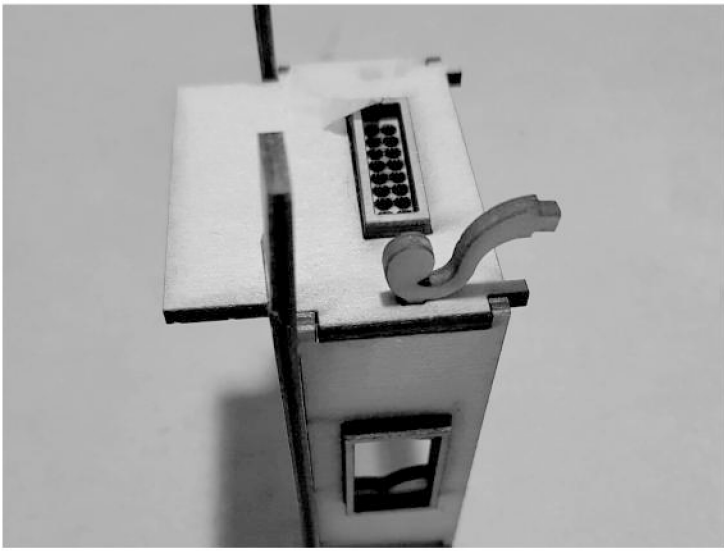
To start your cabin, glue in place the curtain and frame pieces on both side panels. Do the same for the front panel with the multiple hole pieces and the matching frame as shown above.



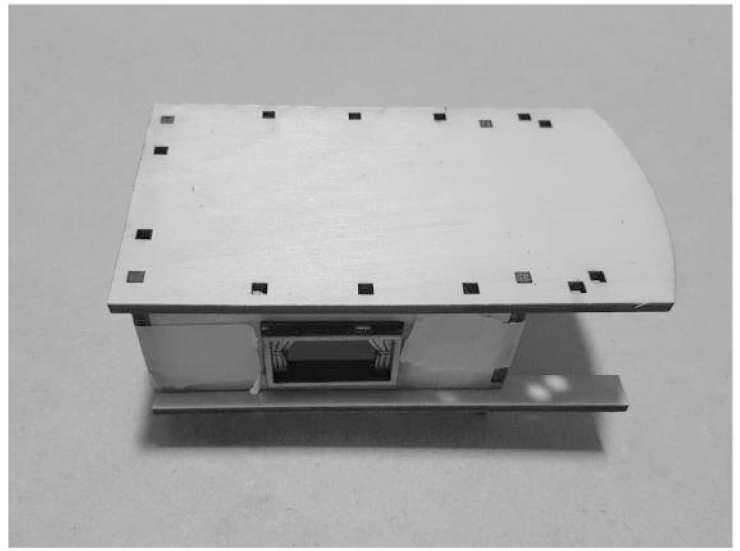
Once the glue is dried on the side panels, glue them onto the magnetic panels (magnets facing downwards). Make sure they are mirrors of eachother and the window frames are placed as shown above.



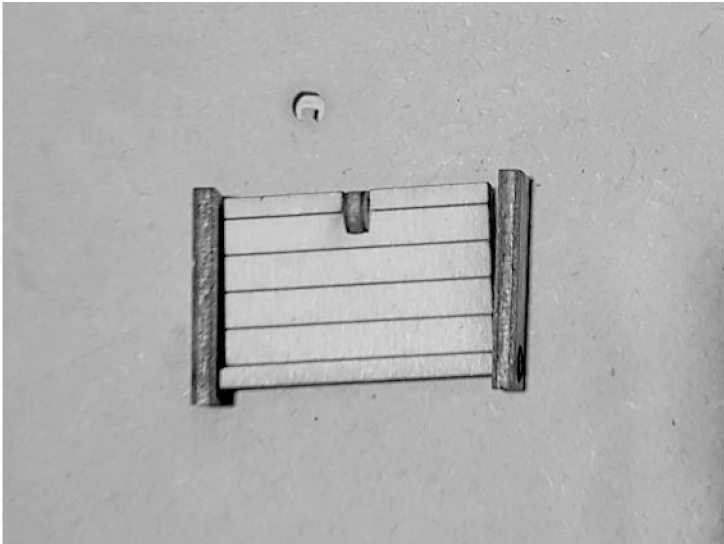
Next, take the two side panels, front panel with frame and back panel with the door hold and glue them into place. The back panel will need to be placed towards the back of the side panels (end with the additional holes) as shown above.



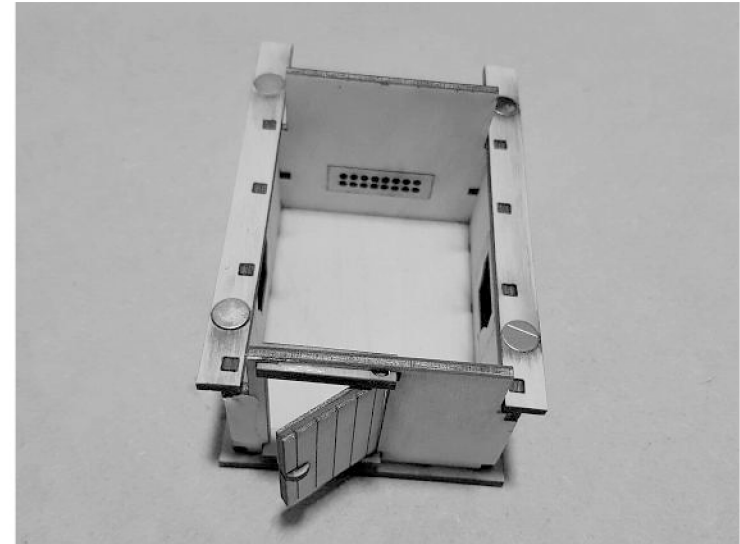
Once the glue is dry, you can attach the curly detail pieces to each side of the front panel. Make sure the large curl is facing downwards as shown above.



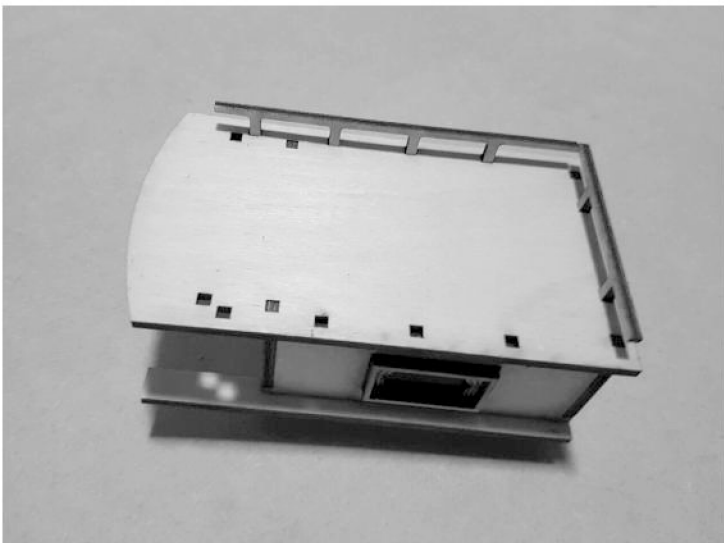
With the curly detail in place, the top roof panel can now be glued on. Make sure the rounded front section of the roof is facing the front of the cabin.



For the door, place the small C shaped piece and push it into the hole provided in the middle of the door. Then place the two door hinge panel onto the door taps at the top and bottom as shown.



Apply a small amount of glue to the top and bottom of the door hinges and place them into the back panel as shown above. Make sure not to get any glue onto the door or it won't be able to rotate.



Once the glue on the door hinges is dry, the roof railings can be glued into the provided holes on top of the roof panel. Once in place, it should look like the above image.



Lastly, apply a little glue to the back of the ladder and place it onto the back panel in the space provided. Once the ladder is in place, your cabin is now complete and ready to use.
